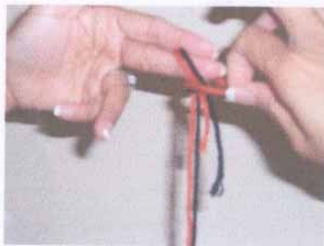
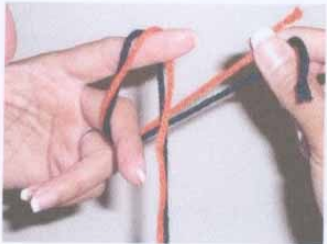
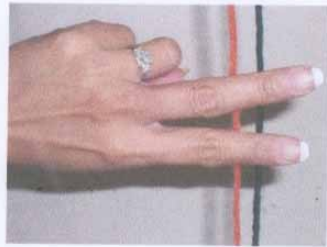


Silk Shimmerz



Instructions:

Visualize bottom of each picture as the scalp.

1. Place your hands as shown, (See Fig. 1), with your right hand holding the silk and a nice strong, single piece of hair together. The fingernails on the left hand are “like eyes, looking at you”.

2. Turn your left hand over, hooking both the silk and the hair, to make a loop. See Fig. 2

3. Take what is in your right hand and put between the two fingers of you left hand. See Fig. 3. **Lock** these two fingers together.

4. Close and lock the two fingers together horizontally and parallel to the scalp, once you have both the silk and the hair wrapped (looped) over your two fingers, then lift these, over the strands which are held vertically between the two fingers. Separate the strands of silk and hair you are working with, freeing from entanglement. **Keep** the two fingers locked together. See Fig. 4

5. To make a knot as close to the root of the hair, you will have to pull the hair first, from the top of your two fingers, while sliding the silk down toward the root then pull the silk from below the two fingers. See Fig. 5. Next, slowly and firmly tighten the knot holding the opposing ends of the silk only, not the hair.
